SB 743 requires Level of Service (LOS) be replaced under existing CEQA guidelines with Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT), a metric that will promote greenhouse gas emission reduction, mixed uses and a multi-modal transportation system. SB 743 will take full effect on July 1, 2020, having profound impacts on how public agencies approve transportation and land use projects. The SB 743 panel will discuss the legislative background, implementation issues, and potential challenges.
